# **Welcome to New CFPA Assistant Director Bob Narus**

In July, CFPA welcomed our new assistant director, Bob Narus, who is actually a very old friend of the Coalition. Bob attended some of our earliest meetings planning the Nuclear Freeze campaign in the early 1980s. He "re-enlisted" in 2006 because, as he puts it, "Thinking about how my tax dollars were being used in the world just made me ill."

Bob has spent his career as a journalist and policy analyst. He was a member of the State House press corps and later covered environmental issues in New Jersey for *The New York Times*. He also served as the Executive Director of the National Housing Institute and the Research Director of the Center for Analysis of Public Issues in Princeton. Besides working for CFPA, he is a consulting to the Grant Results Reporting Unit of The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. He has a masters degree in public affairs from Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School.


