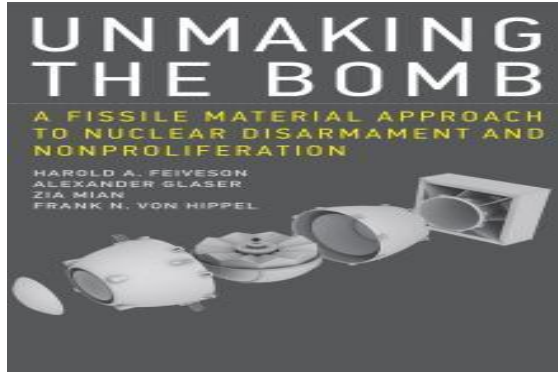

Dr. Zia Mann Dr. Mian directs the Project on Peace and Security in South Asia, at the Program on Science and Global Security. His research and teaching focuses on nuclear weapons and nuclear energy policy, especially in Pakistan and India, and on issues of nuclear disarmament and peace. Previously, he has taught at Yale University and Quaid-i-Azam University, Islamabad, and worked at the Union of Concerned Scientists, Cambridge (Mass.), and the Sustainable Development Policy Institute, Islamabad. He is Co-Editor of *Science & Global Security*, an international journal of technical analysis for arms control, disarmament and nonproliferation policy.

Dr. Frank N. von Hippel A former assistant director for national security in the White House Office of Science and Technology, von Hippel's areas of policy research include nuclear arms control and nonproliferation, energy, and checks and balances in policymaking for technology. Prior to coming to Princeton, he worked for ten years in the field of elementary-particle theoretical physics. He has written extensively on the technical basis for nuclear nonproliferation and disarmament initiatives, and the future of nuclear energy.

On September 26, 1983, Lt. Colonel Stanislav Petrov was the commanding officer on duty at a Soviet early warning center when the system reported the launch of five U.S. nuclear missiles toward the Soviet Union. Procedures called for Soviet missiles to be kept on hair trigger alert, ready to be launched before the incoming missiles hit the ground, giving only minutes to assess the situation and make a launch decision. Ultimately, Petrov overruled the system's warning—despite the fact that the tests showed the sensors to be working correctly—deciding that it was a false alarm and that the Soviet Union should not launch a response.
