

On this day in 1945, at 8:16 AM Japanese time, an American bomber dropped the world's first atom bomb, over the city of Hiroshima. Three days later, the U.S. dropped a second bomb on the city of Nagasaki. The two bombs together killed somewhere between 150,000 and 230,000.
