I am writing to urge your organization to co-sponsor our **42nd Annual Conference and Multifaith Service for Peace on Sunday, November 13 in Princeton, NJ.**

The event begins with a **hybrid 11 AM Multifaith Service at Princeton University Chapel** which is free and open to the public. Those attending in person must attest at the door that they are fully vaccinated. There will also be an option to watch via livestream. Faith leaders from a wide range of backgrounds will co-lead the Service, which will include a free will offering to benefit CFPA.

Preaching will be **Rabbi David Saperstein**, designated by Newsweek Magazine as the most influential rabbi in America and by the Washington Post as the “quintessential religious lobbyist on Capitol Hill.” For 40 years as Director of the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism, David Saperstein represented to Congress and the Administration, the Reform Jewish Movement, the largest segment of American Jewry.

Due to the continuing pandemic, the afternoon **Conference for Peace** will be a virtual **Zoom** event from **2:00-4:00 PM**. The start time is to allow those who may have traveled significant distance to attend the in-person Service to travel back and have lunch beforehand.

Our first confirmed speaker as of now is **Bill McKibben**, who founded the first global grassroots climate campaign, 350.org, and serves as the Schumann Distinguished Professor in Residence at Middlebury College in Vermont.

In 2014 he was awarded the Right Livelihood Prize, sometimes called the ‘alternative Nobel,’ in the Swedish Parliament. He's also won the Gandhi Peace Award, and was awarded honorary degrees from 19 colleges and universities. He has written over a dozen books about the environment, including his first, *The End of Nature*, published in 1989.
